

## EDUCATION REPORT

For this issue of Varda I thought I'd take you on a photo tour of what happens when lighting students are on campus for the IESANZ-accredited lighting course at Massey University. Students meet at the Auckland campus for a total of twelve "contact workshops" over their two years of study. This is where they receive lectures, participate in design workshops, and get hands-on experience in the lighting lab.

In the week prior to me writing this article, the 20 members of the Year 2 class gathered at Massey for their penultimate workshop. We began with some interactive revision, where students used their phones to race against each other in a multi-choice quiz. This provided much laughter and (thankfully for the lecturer) more than a few correct answers.

After the quiz, the topics for the next two days were outlined, and we began an in-depth look at photometry. This was followed by an introduction to road lighting.



On Friday afternoon we were joined by John McKenney of LDP, who kindly spared an hour of his time to lecture on road lighting. John gave tips and tricks for meeting New Zealand's requirements, and provided valuable up-to-the-minute advice.

We're very grateful for supportive IESANZ members such as John, who give their expert time to teach the next generation. Thanks to you all!

Saturday began, as always, with a design workshop with Domenico De Vincentis of S&T. This is the second year that Domenico has been contracted for this role, and his insight and enthusiasm is always enjoyed and appreciated.



## EDUCATION REPORT CONTINUED



Domenico's talk was followed by a discussion and practical demonstration by Chris Chitty, Massey Senior Tutor.

Chris focused on his research area of flicker, and used a series of oscilloscopes to show how waveforms vary depending on the LED drivers and/or dimmers used.

The day concluded after lunch with more core study, this time looking at spectral power distributions. In the upcoming weeks, Year 2 students will be working on their assignments and handing them in through the Class website. Then we'll meet again for the final instalment.

I hope that gives a taste of what we get up to. If you or a colleague are considering studying at Massey in 2019, then I'd love to hear from you. Enrolments will open in October.

The IESANZ also provides short courses, which give an introduction to lighting and are designed for those who are new to the industry. Details are available on the IESANZ website ([iesanz.org](http://iesanz.org)). Please note that the short courses are not run by Massey University, and are not able to be cross-credited to the two-year programme.





LG007 AS/NZS 2293, Parts 1 and 3 are published and part 2 is ready for publication. (Clark Houltram)

LG001 AS/NZS 1680, Update required. (Ewan Café)

LG002 AS/NZS 1158, Currently committee reviewing 1158 3.1. Laurie Cook has attended many meetings in a 'information only' capacity. (Graham Culling)

LG010 AS/NZS 4282, Public submissions ratified, expect publication early next year. (Laurie Cook)

LG009 AS2560, IESANZ Australian representation only on Sports lighting. (David Lewis- information only and Mike Sage participation member)

NZS4243.2, Commercial Building Lighting Standard revision sponsored by EECA. Public submissions ratified, voted and published 2018. (Laurie Cook)

We are not currently involved with LG009 (Australian Only Standard currently).

We are also looking at being involved with the Photo Luminescent Standard if and when it starts as it will include exit signs and low level "lighting".
