HEALTH MESSAGE FROM MARK DEVIN

The most important Ongoing Personal Development = you and your health.

Most of the members of this society carry out audits on product, projects, design, however the one that is most important is you and your health. Most of us don't follow our own maintenance manuals. The checks and tests are overlooked because many are inconvenient, time consuming or expensive. I have just finished reading about a very gifted engineer who recently died from Bowel cancer at age 38. An extensive TV campaign is about to begin about bowel cancer run by the [Jodi Lee Foundation](#).

I have recently been diagnosed with early-stage rectum cancer. If I had waited another six months, it may have been a different story. It appears that cancers are affecting people at a much younger age and the auditing testing period should start earlier.

Initially after looking at yet another out of date poo test, I decided to arrange my own. Apparently somewhere between 60-70% end up in landfill. The test revealed evidence of blood and the journey began. After 3 visits to hospital with one stay lasting seven days, I am about to start a series of chemo. I now have a poo bag or a stoma for approximately three months, allowing for the affected area to heal.

Often it is all too hard, so we should start at the beginning and create a basic personnel maintenance manual with built in KPI's. Using our change and risk management skills, this basic manual should grow into a working document ensuring the procedures are carried out. In reality, a machine needs maintenance and improvement. Remove emotion, and remember that the outcome of the test may change for the next one
