Changes to Awards for 2019

The IESANZ Board and Chapters reviewed the awards and the award process during 2018. They listened to feedback from members, members' clients, award entrants and the awards sponsors. The review looked at what worked and what didn't work. Key areas were identified as needing updating and in the next months changes will be rolled out.

Key areas:

- Relevance - Luminaire award change to include ALL products used in lighting
- Simple payment process for award entries

- Convenor and Judging documentation standardised
- Awards dinner presentations to be more inclusive for all nominations
- Improved ordering for Chapters award trophies etc
- Award process to be described at awards dinner function (NZ does this already)
- Cross chapter engagement
- FAQ section to be added to website

Relevance - Luminaire Awards:


- The Luminaire Award will be changed to Lighting Innovation Award (LuDA - LIIA)
