We have been really busy this month organising tech events and supplier nights for your edification. Thank you to MHL, Beca and the lighting suppliers that are bringing us such fantastic support.

I participated in the first supplier/consultant/contractor panel in Auckland in April, and was privileged privileged to attend the event in Christchurch. It is interesting to see the common themes, and explore the differences. Thank you to all the participants, and the honesty and professionalism that you all displayed at the events.

In Auckland and Christchurch, there was acknowledgement that our perspectives are all different, and learned that others don't always have as straight forward or easy as we maybe have first thought. It was great to see some really beneficial discussions starting between all parties concerned.

In Auckland, suppliers asked contractors for an opportunity to come back with a similar if the originally specified luminaire was too expensive. Consultants wanted to be made aware if alternatives were being sought. In Christchurch, attention to seismic details was more in the forefront of people's minds, and pretty much everyone in the panel agreed that crashing a spec was not productive, and that overall it is not practical to replace any light with any other. Our wholesalers (who were not part of the panel), received a bit of attention and in Auckland were roundly supported by (almost) all of the panel. In Christchurch it was noted that suppliers in particular do not receive all of the pertinent information when being asked to quote on a project. I look forward to running the event in Wellington in the near future and hearing what is important to our Society in that neck of the woods.



Technical Events

Panel Discussion

The panel events held in Auckland and Christchurch recently were great opportunities to start a discussion between suppliers, contractors and consultants on the things that bugged us all about each other. While we did get some very interesting comments, the theme was consistently one of “getting on with it” and making the job easier through understanding each other’s perspective a bit more. In Auckland, we heard that our suppliers would appreciate being given the opportunity to re-price a similar fitting before the electrician went to others to request pricing for something everyone know the consultants wouldn’t possibly accept. Everyone (except the consultants) was a bit surprised to hear that consultants typically can’t claim additional fees if they get asked to evaluate alternative offers from contractors. In Auckland, there was audience participation on the value that Wholesalers add to the marketplace, and in Christchurch, the role of the contractor in seismic fixings was discussed.

The IES has started what I consider to be a fantastic industry conversation and we will keep it up, with an event planned in **Wellington next month**, and further panel discussions in the wind for later in the year. Thank you to all that contributed and are going to contribute to this ongoing discussion in the future.
